IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Relating to County Sheriffs.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 30-A MRSA §1501, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2 and Pt. C, §106 and as amended by PL 1989, cc. 6 and 9, is further amended to read:

7 §1501. Custody of jail and prisoners; jailer

9 The sheriff has the custody and charge of the county jail and of all prisoners in that jail and shall keep it in person, or
11 by a deputy <u>or designee</u> as jailer, master or keeper.

Subordinate assistants and employees. The Except as 1. provided in subsection 4, the jailer, master or keeper shall appoint, subject to the requirements of section 501, all subordinate assistants and employees. Subordinate assistants and employees shall be appointed for the same period that is provided deputy sheriffs under section 381. for The professional qualifications required of them must emphasize training or experience in or knowledge of corrections. The jailer, master or keeper and all subordinate assistants and employees are subject to the training requirements of Title 25, section 2805.

2. Compensation. The Except as provided in subsection 4, the pay of the jailer, master or keeper and all subordinate assistants and employees shall be set by the county commissioners and paid by their respective counties, except when otherwise provided by law.

3. Jailer and subordinates may be deputies. The jailer and the jailer's subordinate assistants and employees may be deputy sheriffs.

 4. Contract with private corporation. Notwithstanding any
other provision contained in this Title, the county commissioners and the sheriff may enter into a contract with a private
corporation for the operation and management of the county jail. The period of operation of the jail by the private corporation
and the compensation to be paid by the county shall be governed by the contract.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides that county commissioners and the sheriff may contract with a private corporation to manage and operate a county jail.
