Sec. 1. Study concerning the possible migration of Africanized bees to Maine. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources shall undertake a study concerning the possible migration of Africanized bees to Maine, with input from representatives of state and federal agencies, other states and public interest groups. The study shall include the potential health issues posed by the infiltration of Africanized bees and include recommendations to prevent the movement of Africanized bees into Maine; and be it further

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the commissioner shall submit a report, including any necessary implementing legislation, to the ll4th Legislature by December 1, 1989.
