## STATEMENT OF FACT

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5	The United States Office of Management and Budget has
	recently issued regulations requiring that any use of federal
7	funds, such as highway grants, Veterans Administration and
	Farmers Home Administration loans, after July 1, 1991, be
9	prohibited unless the real estate appraiser for the project is
	state licensed or state certified, depending on the complexity of
11	the project. Maine currently has no real estate appraisal
	licensing or certification law. This resolve establishes a
13	commission to study the best way to implement the necessary law
	and is to report to the 114th Legislature so that necessary
15	legislation can be passed to be effective in advance of the July
	1, 1991 deadline.
