STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Concerning the Public Advocate.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	35-A MRSA §1701, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 141, Pt. A, §6, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
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7	1. Election of the Public Advocate. The Public Advocate shall be elected by the Legislature by a joint ballot of the
9	Senate and the House of Representatives in convention and shall hold office for a term of 4 years or until a successor is elected and qualified. If the office of Public Advocate becomes vacant
11	during a period when the Legislature is not in session, the appointment of a person to fill the vacancy shall be made
13	immediately by the President of the Senate or if that office be vacant, by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The
15	person so appointed shall hold office until such time as the Legislature meets, in regular or special session, and either
17	confirms the appointment of that person or chooses another person to fill the office during the unexpired term.
19	In order to provide for an orderly transition following the
21	biennial election of the Public Advocate, the Public Advocate-elect shall not take the oath of office or otherwise
23	<u>qualify for the office for a period of no less than 30 days</u> following that election.
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27	STATEMENT OF FACT
29	This bill provides that the Public Advocate shall be elected
31	to office in the same manner as is the State Auditor.

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
