## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6601, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is amended to read:

3. Eligibility. A shellfish license shall only be issued to an individual and-<u>shall-be-a-resident-license</u>. <u>Any Maine</u> <u>resident, nonresident or alien is eligible to apply for a</u> <u>shellfish license.</u>

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6671, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1987, c. 867, is further amended to read:

3. Shellfish conservation ordinance. Within any area of the municipality, a shellfish conservation ordinance may regulate 15 or prohibit the possession of shellfish; may fix the amount of 17 shellfish that may be taken; shall limit the size of soft-shell clams in accordance with article 5; may fix the qualifications 19 for a license, -- including - municipal -- residency; may -- fix - license fees; and may authorize the municipal officers to open and close 21 flats under specified conditions. A program or ordinance shall not regulate areas closed by regulation of the commissioner. An 23 ordinance may also provide for enforcement, protection and evaluation of a green crab fencing program. No municipal 25 commercial license may be issued unless the applicant has a current shellfish license, as provided in section 6601. Ŧhe 27 municipality Licenses shall provide-and-reserve-a-minimum-number ef-commercial-licenses-fer-nonresidents-which-shall be a-number net-less-than-10% of-the number-provided for residents offered to 29 applicants on a first-come, first-served basis. When-the-number 31 ef-resident-licenses-is-less-than-10-but-more-than-5,-at-least enc--nonresident-license--shall-be--provided--When-the-number--ef 33 resident-licenses-is-5-or-less,-nonresident-licenses-shall-not-be required. The fee for a nonresident license shall be not more 35 than 19-times-the-fee-for-a-resident-license, provided that in-no ease-may-the-fee-for-a-nonresident-license-exceed-\$150 \$10. 37 Notice of the number and the procedure for application shall be published in a trade or industry publication or in a newspaper or 39 combination of newspapers with general circulation which the persons municipal officers consider effective in reaching 41 affected not less than 10 days prior to the period of issuance and shall be posted in the municipal offices until the period 43 concludes. The-period-of-issuance-for-resident-and-nonresidentlicenses--shall--be--the--same ---Subsequent--to--that--period,--the 45 munieipality-shall-make-any-resident-or-nonresident-licenses-not granted-during-the-period-available-to-residents-or-nonresidents-

Sec. 3. Reimbursement for lost license fee revenues. The Department of Marine Resources shall make a one-time payment to municipalities to reimburse them for any license fee revenues foregone as a result of this law. This payment shall consist of the difference between the license fee revenues collected by a 1 municipality in the year prior to the effective date of this Act and the amount of license fee revenues collected by that 3 municipality under the license fee provisions of this law.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

9 This bill revises the guidelines for issuance of municipal commercial shellfish licenses. Under current law, a municipality 11 must provide a minimum number of nonresident shellfish licenses, for which it may charge up to 10 times more than the charge for a 13 resident shellfish license. This bill would eliminate the distinction between resident and nonresident licenses and would limit the fee for these licenses to \$10. 15 The Department of Marine Resources will reimburse municipalities for the revenue 17 foregone as a result of the reduction in fees.
