Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §5108-A, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 58, §2, is amended to read:

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- 3. Terms and reappointments. Legislative members shall serve during their legislative terms. The other members shall be appointed for terms of 3 years. Members may be reappointed, but no member may serve more than 2 consecutive full terms of 3 years each. Members may serve after the expiration of their terms until their successors have been appointed and qualified. The appointment at the expiration of a member's term shall be made by the officer who appointed that member.
- A. The Geverner appointing officer may terminate the appointment of any member of the committee appointed by him the officer for just cause and the reason for the termination of each appointment shall be communicated to each member terminated. The appointment of any member of the committee shall be terminated if a member is absent from 3 consecutive meetings without just cause that is communicated to the chairman chair.

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- Sec. 5. 22 MRSA §5112, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 793, §11, is amended to read:
- 6. Inform the public. Inform the public in consultation with the bureau, to develop a firm public understanding of the current status of the survival of Maine's elderly, including information on effective programs elsewhere in the State or nation, by collecting and disseminating information, conducting or commissioning studies and publishing the results thereof and by issuing publications and reports for which a reasonable fee may be charged;
