Resolve, to Create a Pilot Program to Provide the Driver Education and Evaluation Program to Persons Incarcerated for Driving under the Influence of Drugs or Alcohol.



Sec. 1. Pilot program. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services shall develop as a pilot project the provision of the Driver Education Evaluation Program to persons incarcerated for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Under the pilot program, initial portions of the Driver 7 Education Evaluation Program will be made available in nonjail incarcerated persons while they serve settings to their sentences. If the period of incarceration is insufficient to complete the program, the remainder of the program shall be completed after release from jail; and be it further 11

Sec. 2. Results of project. Resolved: 13 That the Department of Human Services shall review the feasibility, effectiveness and costs of providing on a statewide basis portions of the Driver 15 Education Evaluation Program to persons durinq their incarceration. The results of this project shall be published in 17 a final report to be submitted to the 114th Legislature by 19 February 1, 1990.
