Dumping Stations.**



1 **Sec. 1. Demonstration project. Resolved:** That the Department of
Transportation, Bureau of Maintenance and Operations, shall
3 develop as a demonstration project 2 dumping stations for
recreational vehicles at rest areas on Interstate 95.

6 In carrying out this resolve, the bureau shall determine the
7 appropriate sites for the stations, select a contractor or
contractors to build the stations, develop and implement the
9 necessary procedures to administer the project and establish a
nominal fee to help defray the operating costs; and be it further

11 **Sec. 2. Results of project. Resolved:** That the results of this
13 project shall be published in a final report to be submitted to
the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature by December
15 1, 1990.

17 STATEMENT OF FACT

19 State and municipal restrictions on the dumping of waste are
increasingly strict. This bill creates, as a demonstration
21 project, 2 dumping stations for recreational vehicles at rest
areas on Interstate 95. The project shall be established,
23 implemented and overseen by the Department of Transportation,
Bureau of Maintenance and Operations. Results from the project
25 shall be reported to the Legislature. If the demonstration
proves successful, it will be used as a model for an ongoing
27 statewide plan.
