IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Prohibit the Use of State Funds to Subsidize the Implementation of Alternative Sentencing Options.



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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## 17-A MRSA §1204, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

5 4. If the convicted person is required pursuant to subsection 2-A, paragraph D, to be devoted to an approved
7 employment or occupation, neither the convicted person nor any corporation, partnership or other legal entity employing that
9 person shall be eligible to receive any state funds the purpose of which is to directly implement the sentencing plan.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

15 The intention of alternative sentence plans is to provide public service in lieu of incarceration. Under current law, a 17 convicted person can apply to the State Government for public funding of an alternative sentence. This bill prevents this 19 funding by prohibiting state funds from being used to implement sentencing plans which require convicted persons to perform some 21 type of community service.
