29 This bill creates and funds the position of liquor
31 enforcement officer for Washington County within the Bureau of
33 Liquor Enforcement. Presently, there is no full-time liquor
enforcement officer living in the Washington County area. The
closest liquor enforcement officer to Washington County is
located in Bangor and, due to the lengthy distance, there is
little or no liquor law enforcement in Washington County.
