The interim report shall include, but need not be limited to, a review and assessment of the 37 educator certification requirements, an examination of the 39 educator training programs available to Maine educators and potential educators and recommendations or legislation necessary educator 41 enhance coordination of certification to the requirements and available educator training programs.
