## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Apply a Portion of Dedicated Funds from the Premium Tax on Alcohol towards Grants for Recreational Activities for Children.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	28-A MRSA §1705 is enacted to read:

7	1. Fund established. Notwithstanding section 1704, 5% of the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund

	STATEMENT OF FACT

	This bill requires that 5% of the Alcoholism Prevention,
29	Education, Treatment and Research Fund is to be allocated each year to a fund established by this bill, to be known as the "Good
31	Samaritan Fund." The fund is to be administered by the Office of
	Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention and will be available to
33	counties and municipalities for the purpose of providing recreational facilities designed to prevent the consumption of

alcohol or drugs.
