#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §436-A, sub-\$11, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 815, §§3 and 11, is amended to read:
- 11. River. "River" means a free-flowing body of water from
  that point at which it provides drainage-for-a-watershed-of-25
  square-miles-the outlet of a great pond or from the point of
  confluence with another flowing body of water depicted on the
  most recent edition of a United States Geological Survey
  11 7.5-minute or 15-minute series topographic map to its mouth.
- Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §482, sub-§4-E, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 812, §§6 and 18, is amended to read:
- 4-E. River. "River" means a free-flowing body of water from that point at which it provides drainage-fer-a-watershed-of 25-square-miles the outlet of a great pond or from the point of confluence with another flowing body of water depicted on the most recent edition of a United States Geological Survey 7.5-minute or 15-minute services topographic map to its mouth.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill changes the definition of "river" in the site 27 location of development laws and the mandatory zoning and subdivision control laws to increase the jurisdiction of the 29 Department of Environmental Protection along certain water bodies. Projects located within 250 feet of a river are subject to Department of Environmental Protection review. Current law 31 describes only about 15% of rivers as "rivers" due to limitations 33 in the definition of the term. This bill expands the number of water bodies included in the definition to approximately 40%. 35 The size of the watershed is dropped in favor of a map reference to ease the resolution of questions about which water bodies 37 qualify as rivers.
