STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Provide an Opportunity to Claim Medical Benefits for Persons Previously Covered under a Spouse's Policy. 1

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §285, sub-§1, ¶C-1 is enacted to read:

C-1. A person who was, at the date of leaving state service, eligible under this section for enrollment in the group accident and sickness or health insurance plan as a retiree and who is enrolled in the group accident and sickness or health insurance plan as the surviving spouse of a retiree may, within a period of 6 months after the effective date of this subsection, enroll in the group accident and sickness or health insurance plan as a retiree.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §285, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1987, c. 731, $\S3$, is further amended to read: 15

3. Enrollment. Any employee eligible under this section may join within the first 60 days of employment or during a declared open enrollment period. The filing of necessary applications shall be the responsibility of the employer. Effective dates under this section shall be at the discretion of the commission, with the exception of the date specified in subsection 1, paragraph C-1.

STATEMENT OF FACT

29 This bill allows former state employees, who were eligible for state health insurance coverage at the date of leaving state service because of that service and who were also eligible for 31 coverage, and are in fact covered, as surviving spouses of former state employees, to enroll in the state health insurance plan in their own capacity as former employees within a period of 6 35 months after the effective date of this bill.
