An Act to Allow Corporations to Appear without Legal Counsel for Minor Civil Infractions.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	4 MRSA §807-B is enacted to read:
5	§807-B. Representation by corporations
7	Notwithstanding section 807, a corporation charged with
9	minor infraction may represent itself in a court of law. For the purpose of this section, "minor infraction" means any civitation having a maximum forfeiture of up to \$500.

13	STATEMENT OF FACT
15	This bill allows corporations to appear in court without legal counsel for minor infractions having a maximum forfeiture
