STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides funds to carry out the first phase of the
master plan recommended in the final report of the Juvenile
Corrections Planning Commission.

Funds provided to the Maine Criminal Justice Academy will
support more extensive juvenile-oriented training for law
enforcement officers. These funds will also support a grants
program to encourage local law enforcement agencies to improve
their capacity to handle juveniles.

Funds provided to the Department of Corrections will support
the establishment of a Bureau of Juvenile Corrections, the
specialization and supplementation of existing juvenile field
services and the creation of an integrated spectrum of
community-based sanctions and services.
