	1. Advisory board established. There is established a
17	Nursing Profession Advisory Board. This board shall be composed of 19 persons to be appointed by the Commissioner of Labor and

21	care provider; 2 representatives of extended care facilities; one
23	representative of a nursing home; 2 nurse practitioners; 3 members involved in nursing education, including one from education universities, one from vocational-technical institutes
25	and one from continuing adult education; 2 high school
27	counselors; one member of the Additional Support for People in Retraining Education program and one member from the Welfare Employment, Education and Training program. In appointing the
