17	Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated " <u>§5161.</u> " by striking out all of subsection 1 and inserting in its place
19	the following:
21	' <u>1. Children at risk.</u> "Children at risk" means children, ages 5 to 13, who are identified to be at risk under one or more
23	of the following criteria:
25	A. Read at a level 2 years or more below the average grade level and lack other readiness skills;
27	B. Have_been retained in a grade level at least once;
29	C. Disobey school rules and regularly defy authority:
31	D. Receive free or reduced price lunch;
33	E. Have been referred to the Department of Human Services
35	for the provision of child services; or
37	F. Receive help in speech and language development.'
39	Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated " <u>\$5162.</u> " by striking out all of subsection 1 and inserting in its
41	place the following:
43	' <mark>1. Establishment.</mark> The department shall establish <u>3</u> demonstration projects for the identification and delivery of
45	services to children at risk. Each project shall be a collaborative effort between a school administrative unit and the
47	community or communities which it serves. The department shall

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1 select the 3 school units for these projects by issuing invitations to units under guidelines and procedures to be 3 developed by the commissioner. Grants received by school units will be used to administer the project and for hiring a coordinator.' 5 7 Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>\$5162.</u>" in subsection 2 in paragraph C in the last line (page 1, 9 line 41 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "agencies;" and inserting in its place the following: 'agencies, including 11 development of models providing for the transfer of case management responsibilities from preschool sites or programs to the school adminstrative unit's early intervention program;" 13 Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated 15 " $\underline{S5162.}$ " in subsection 4 in the 2nd line (page 2, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "communities, each community" and 17 inserting in its place the following: 'school administrative 19 units, each unit' Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated 21 "<u>§5162.</u>" in subsection 4 in the 3rd line (page 2, line 6 in L.D.) by striking out the following "community" and inserting in its 23 place the following: 'school administrative unit' 25 Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 3 and 27 inserting in its place the following: 29 'Sec. 3.
