An Act to Facilitate Collaboration Among School Agencies and Community Leaders Working on Behalf of At-risk Children.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21	1. Establishment. The department shall establish 3 demonstration projects for the identification and delivery of
23	services to children at risk. Each project shall be a collaboration with a school administrative unit and the community where the unit is located.
25	2. Purposes. Each project shall seek to ensure that a full
27	spectrum of services is available to address the problems of children at risk. Each project shall be designed to serve the
29	entire community population of elementary school children at risk because of multiple problems. The project shall include, but
31	need not be limited to, the following activities:
33	A. Identification of children in the target population;
35	B. Early intervention to increase the children's self-esteem and achievement and prevent the development of
37	more serious problems;
39	C. Development and implementation of models for delivery of case management services for children and families involved
