#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Increase the Fine for Improper Use of Handicapped Parking Spaces.

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#### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §252, first ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1987, c. 298, §1, is amended to read:

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On annual application to the Secretary of State, any 7 handicapped person or the spouse, parents or legal guardian of a handicapped person who has registered a motor vehicle as the 9 motor vehicle of principal use by the handicapped person shall be issued a set of special designating plates to be used in place of 11 the regular registration plates or placard to be fixed to the sun visor of a motor vehicle registered by such a person. The placard 13 shall be so affixed that the information thereon shall be clearly legible from outside the motor vehicle. The placard issued under 15 this section shall include the motor vehicle registration plate number of the vehicle registered in the name of the handicapped 17 person the spouse, parents or legal quardian of the or handicapped person, the name of the handicapped person and the 19 date of expiration of the placard. The Secretary of State shall establish by regulation a system of color coding for placards 21 issued pursuant to this section for the purpose of facilitating the determination of validity of placards. When the Secretary of State deems it appropriate, a placard may be issued to any 23 handicapped person who does not have a duly registered motor 25 vehicle. In such cases, the placard may be displayed on any motor vehicle properly registered in this State, but it may only be so 27 displayed during the time when the handicapped person is a passenger in the vehicle, when the driver of the vehicle is 29 transporting the handicapped person or when the driver is waiting for a service to be rendered to the handicapped person. The annual registration fee is as set forth in this subchapter for 31 the type of vehicle assigned the special designating plates or 33 placard. A \$1 fee shall be charged in those cases where a placard is issued to a handicapped person who does not have a duly 35 registered motor vehicle. The Secretary of State shall establish and implement an identification system that shall include an identification card with the handicapped person's photograph 37 present on the card to assist law enforcement officers in maintaining the proper use of handicapped parking spaces. 39

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Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §252, 2nd ¶, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 298, §1, is amended to read:

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On annual application to the Secretary of State, any handicapped person who has registered a motorcycle shall be issued a special designating plate to be used in place of the regular registration plate, and beginning January 1, 1990, shall also be issued an identification card.

Sec. 3. 30-A MRSA §3009, sub-§1, ¶D, as repealed and replaced 51 by PL 1989, c. 104, Pt. A, §28, is amended to read: D. The following provisions apply to the establishment and policing of parking spaces for handicapped persons.

(1) Municipal public parking areas are subject to any applicable requirements of the Maine Human Rights Act, Title 5, chapter 337, subchapter V. The municipality shall post a sign adjacent to and visible from each handicapped parking space established by the municipality. The sign shall display the international symbol for accessibility.

(2) Owners of private off-street parking shall arrange for private enforcement or shall enter into agreements with local or county law enforcement agencies to enforce handicapped parking restrictions. Under these agreements, unauthorized vehicles will be ticketed. An owner of private off-street parking who fails to arrange for private enforcement or to enter into an agreement with a law enforcement agency commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not less than \$50 may be adjudged.

Under these agreements, public law enforcement officials may ensure that parking spaces designated for the handicapped are used appropriately by handicapped persons, whether the designated handicapped parking spaces are located on public lots or on private lots open to the public. Handicapped parking restrictions in private lots may also be enforced by county or municipal volunteer parking enforcement specialists as provided in sections 471 and 472.

Where service facilities are established on the Maine
Turnpike and on the interstate highway system in the
State, the State Police shall enforce any handicapped
parking restrictions at those facilities.

Any vehicle or motorcycle parked in a parking (3) space clearly marked as a handicapped parking space and which does not bear a special registration plate or placard issued under Title 29, sections 252, 252-A and 252-C, or a similar plate issued by another state, shall be cited for a forfeiture of not less than \$50 Of that penalty, the person, if any, who <u>\$100</u>. reported the violation to the police or local law enforcement agency shall receive \$25, provided that the person is not a law enforcement officer. "Clearly marked" includes painted signs on pavement and vertical standing signs which are visible in existing weather conditions.

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21 This bill increases the penalty for unlawful parking in a handicapped parking space to \$100, \$25 of which shall be given to 23 the person who reported the violation to the police. This bill creates the same fine and reward when a vehicle with special 25 handicapped plates is parked in a handicapped parking space, but is not being used to transport the person with the disability. 27-1

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
