An Act to Establish a Portland Neighborhood Library System.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the residents of the City of Portland face losing their neighborhood library services; and

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Whereas, the library, known as the Portland Public Library, is a private library that does not provide for any publicly elected or appointed trustees; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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- Sec. 1. Portland Neighborhood Libraries. Portland Neighborhood Libraries is hereby established and shall constitute a body politic for the purposes of establishing and maintaining a neighborhood library system in Portland. For the purposes of this Act, "neighborhood library" means a lending library which is open at least 2/3 of the average of the number of hours that the regional libraries in the State are open. The Portland Neighborhood Libraries shall include, but not be restricted to, libraries located in neighborhoods known as Riverton, the West End, Munjoy Hill, Deering Center and Peaks Island.
- 31 Sec. 2. Powers of Portland Neighborhood Libraries. The Portland Neighborhood Libraries may take and hold real and personal estate 33 donations, grants, devises or bequests in any amount. libraries shall have the same access to services and city, county and state lending as other public libraries. 35 The Portland Neighborhood Libraries shall provide for the use, protection and 37 preservation of the property of the libraries and of all collections of books, papers, manuscripts, curiosities, 39 antiquities or works of art under its charge, and for the addition of neighborhood libraries to the neighborhood library 41 The Portland Neighborhood Libraries may establish a system for use, abuse, injury or loss of its property, which system may, from time to time, be modified and amended as shall 43 be judged expedient.

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Sec. 3. City of Portland property and funds. The City of Portland may appropriate and pay, annually, toward the expenses of establishing and maintaining the Portland Neighborhood Libraries system, and may also furnish rooms for its accommodations. The Portland Neighborhood Libraries system shall allow the inhabitants of the City of Portland to have free access to its libraries, for the purpose using and enjoying the same on

the premises. The property of the libraries shall be exempt from taxation. The Portland City Council shall at the request of the board of trustees put out for vote to the citizens of Portland the question of the city taking the property and rights to be used and maintained for the purposes of free public neighborhood libraries, under such regulation as provided in this Act for management, preservation and protection of the material of the libraries as the city may from time to time establish and shall be held only to pay and discharge any existing debt and liabilities of the Portland Neighborhood Libraries.

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If the City of Portland finds itself with annual requests from more than one library or library system providing free access to services to its residents, the library or library system with the largest percentage of trustees publicly elected by the registered voters in a city-wide election in a manner prescribed by the Portland City Charter for council and school committee members will be first assured of fiscal sufficiency to carry out its purpose as prescribed in its charter.

- Sec. 4. Board of Trustees; how elected; officers; immunity. All of the affairs of Portland Neighborhood Libraries shall be managed by a board of trustees composed of 9 members who shall serve for 3-year terms, except as provided in this section. Two of the trustees shall be appointed by the Portland City Council and 2 trustees shall be appointed by the Portland School Committee, provided that the trustees are residents of the City of Portland. Nominations and elections for the remaining 5 trustees shall be conducted in accordance with the laws relating to municipal elections, provided that each of the 5 city council districts must be represented by one trustee who is a resident of Appointments must be made under this section that district. within 60 days of the effective date of this Act and elections must be held at the first city-wide election after the effective date of this Act.
- 1. The first order of the board of trustees shall be to draw by lot to fix the terms of the trustees. Of the original trustees:
- A. The trustee from Council District 4, the trustee from Council District 5 and one council-appointed trustee shall serve for one year;
- B. The trustee from Council District 1, the trustee from Council District 2 and one school committee-appointed trustee shall serve for 2 years; and
- 49 C. The remainder of the trustees shall serve for 3 years.
- 2. The board of trustees shall elect from their number a president and vice-president, and may appoint a secretary,

treasurer, librarian and other proper and necessary officers and assistants who need not be members of the board. The terms of office shall be determined by the board of trustees.

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- 3. All decisions of the board of trustees shall be by a majority of those present and voting. A quorum of the board of trustees shall be 5 trustees.
- 9 4. The board of trustees is deemed to be a political subdivision and the trustees are deemed to be employees for the purposes of the Maine Revised Statutes, Maine Tort Claims Act, Title 14, chapter 741.
- 5. The board of trustees is authorized to incorporate the Portland Neighborhood Libraries system pursuant to the procedures established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 13-B or its successor.
- Sec. 5. Closing of library; referendum. Unless a city-wide referendum is held on the issue, a library in the Portland Neighborhood Libraries system may be closed or moved, have its hours shortened by more than 30% in one year or 50% in 5 years or otherwise substantially alter service at its locations which would impede use by the neighborhood.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide access to public libraries to Portland neighborhoods and enables the citizens of Portland to have a publicly elected body which has the authority to provide and the accountability for neighborhood library
