IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Revise the Asbestos Certification Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 1 Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1272, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 448, 3 \$1-C, is amended to read: 5 6. Asbestos abatement worker. "Asbestos abatement worker" 7 means an-employee-of-an any worker performing asbestos abatement contractor--engaged--in--asbestos--abatement activity under--the supervision-of-an-asbestos-abatement-project-supervisor for any 9 employer. 11 Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §1272, sub-§14, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 448, 13 \$1-C, is repealed. Sec. 3. 38 MRSA §1273, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 448, 15 \$1-C, is repealed. 17 Sec. 4. 38 MRSA §1274, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 448, 19 §1-C, is amended to read: 21 5. Asbestos abatement worker. All employees engaged in asbestos abatement activities and not otherwise certified under this chapter shall be certified as asbestos abatement workers. 23 To qualify for certification, an applicant shall show evidence 25 satisfactory to the commissioner that he the applicant has completed <u>32 hours of training in</u> a training course certified by 27 the commissioner as appropriate for the safe and proper removal, encapsulation or handling of asbestos. The--commissioner-shall 29 provide-for-interim-certification-for-a-period-mot-to-exceed-30 days-upon-completion-of-a-worker-orientation-program-approved-by the-commissioner. 31 33 STATEMENT OF FACT 35 37 The law requiring training and certification of people engaged in asbestos abatement activities currently exempts those employees working on asbestos abatement activities in buildings 39 owned or leased by their employers. There is no evidence that the risk to the worker is any less serious than that of an 41 employee of a contractor. In fact, it would seem that the worker 43 who is exposed daily to the asbestos hazard should be at least as well trained as the employee who works for a contractor in the facility. 45 47 Current law does not address the number of hours of training required for asbestos abatement workers. This bill provides that 49 32 hours are required for all employees performing asbestos abatement work.
