An Act to Provide Funding for and to Amend Laws Governing the Maine Human Services Council.

(EMERGENCY)

47	The eeuneil commission shall consist of no more than 17 members, who, excepting members representing the Legislature,		
49	shall be appointed by the Covernor. To be qualified to corve		
49	shall be appointed by the Governor. To be qualified to serve, members shall have education, training, experience, knowledge, expertise and interest in human services development. Members		

who reflect experiential diversity and concern for human services development in the State.

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They shall be selected from outstanding people in the fields of education, health, income maintenance and security, juvenile services, law, law enforcement, corrections, manpower, medical care, mental health, mental retardation, poverty and community action activities, rehabilitation, social service, welfare, youth services, services to older people, and related areas. Members shall have an unselfish and dedicated personal interest demonstrated by active participation in human service—programs-development endeavors.

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Membership shall include representatives of nongovernmental organizations or groups and of public agencies concerned with human services development. At least 2 members of the council commission shall be current Members of the Legislature, one member from the House of Representatives consisting of appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives to serve at his the Speaker's pleasure and one member from the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate to serve at his the President's pleasure. One private citizen member shall be between the ages of 16 and 21, one shall be age 60 or over, and one shall be representative of services to children. Three members shall be persons who, at the time appointed and qualified, shall be current consumers of human services development endeavors. Three members shall be officials of public or private nonprofit community level agencies who are actively engaged in human services development in public or private nonprofit community agencies. Six members shall be public members who shall be citizens at large who are not consumers of human services development and who are not employees of any public or private nonprofit human service development agency.

Members shall be appointed for a term of 3 years, except that of the members first appointed, 5 shall be appointed for a term of 3 years, 5 shall be appointed for a term of 2 years and 5 shall be appointed for a term of one year, as designated by the Governor at the time of appointment; except that any member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his that member's predecessor was appointed shall be appointed only for the remainder of such term, and except that members who are members of the current Legislature and who are appointed by the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve at their pleasure. Any vacancy in the equaeil commission shall not affect its powers, but shall be filled in the same manner by which the original appointment was made.

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Members shall be eligible for reappointment for not more than 2 full consecutive terms and may serve after the expiration of their term until their successors have been appointed,

1 qualified and taken office. The appointing authority terminate the appointment of any member of the equaeil commission 3 for good and just cause and the reason for the termination of each appointment shall be communicated to each member 5 The appointment of any member of the terminated. commission shall be terminated if a member is absent from 3 7 consecutive meetings without good and just cause that is communicated to the ehairman chair. An official, 9 consultant or any other individual employed, retained otherwise compensated by or representative of the Executive 11 Branch of the Government of the State of-Maine shall not be a member of the council commission; but shall assist the council commission if so requested. 13

The Governor shall designate the ehairman chair from among the members appointed to the eeuneil commission. The eeuneil commission may elect such other officers from its members as it deems appropriate.

§5315. Administrative authority

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The eeuneil <u>commission</u> shall meet at the call of the ehairman <u>chair</u> or at the call of 1/4 of the members appointed and currently holding office. The eeuneil <u>commission</u> shall meet at least once every 3 months. The eeuneil <u>commission</u> shall keep minutes of all meetings, including a list of people in attendance. Minutes-of-all-meetings-shall-be-sent-ferthwith-to-the-Geverner-and-the-leadership-of-the-Legislature.

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The -council--may-employ, --subject-to--the-Civil--Service-Law, such--staff-as--is--necessary--to--carry--out--its--objectives---The council-may-employ-consultants-and-contract--for--such--projects-as it--deems--necessary. --State--agencies, --to--the--extent--feasible--and reasonable, --shall--make--available--to--the--council--such--staff, facilities, --equipment, --supplies, --information--and--other-assistance as-it-may-reasonably-require-to-carry-out-its-activities.

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The commission may employ, subject to the Civil Service Law, such staff as is necessary to carry out its statutory powers and duties. The commission is authorized to utilize the direct hire provision when recruiting potential employees. The compensation of the commission's executive director shall be set within range 32 of the salary schedule applicable to confidential employees. The commission may employ consultants and contract for such projects as it deems necessary. State agencies, to the extent feasible and reasonable, shall make available to the commission such staff, facilities, equipment, supplies, information and other assistance as it may reasonably require to carry out its activities.

Any reasonable and proper expenses of the eeuneil commission shall be borne out of currently available state or federal funds.

- Each member of the eeuneil commission shall be be compensated according to the provisions of Title 5, chapter 379. The eeuneil commission may appoint subcommittees consisting of its own members and allow guests of the eeuneil commission to attend any and all meetings.
 - A majority of the eeuneil commission members shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting the business of the eeuneil commission and exercising all the powers of the eeuneil commission. A vote of the majority of the members present shall be sufficient for all actions of the eeuneil commission.

13 Any and all reasonable steps shall be taken to provide federal matching funds on a high priority basis for the eeuneil commission. All expenditures of the eouneil commission eligible 15 for federal funds shall be claimed at the highest appropriate rate of federal matching funds pursuant to various federal laws, 17 including, but not limited to, those relating to Title XX Social 19 Services, Title XIX Medicaid and Title IV or Title VI, or their successors or amendments or additions thereto, of the United States Social Security Act, as amended, Aid to Families with 21 Dependent Children of the United States Social Security Act, federal block grant funds, alcoholism, drug abuse and mental 23 health, child abuse, developmental disabilities, education, energy, health, juvenile justice, low-income energy assistance, 25 and other human development, health, income supplementation, social service, training, transportation or winterization funds 27 or grants. Any balances of funds appropriated to the Maine Human 29 Services-Council Development Commission remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward from 31 year to year to be expended for the same purpose.

§5316. Powers and duties

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The eeuneil commission shall have, regarding human services development endeavors, including services to older people funded by Title VI, or their successors or amendments or additions thereto, of the <u>United States</u> Social Security Act, as amended, and excepting all other services to older people, the power and duty to:

Advise, consult and assist. Advise, consult and assist the Executive and Legislative Branches of State Government, especially the Governor, on activities of State Government related to human services development endeavors, except those related to older people. The council commission shall be solely The advisory in nature. eeuneil commission may recommendations regarding any function intended to improve the quality of those human services development endeavors. findings, comments or recommendations of the eeuneil commission vary from or are in addition to those of a state agency, those statements of the eouneil commission shall be sent to

respective branches of State Government as attachments to those submitted by a state agency. Recommendations may take the form of proposed budgetary, legislative or policy actions;

- 2. Serve as an advocate. Serve as an advocate on behalf of human services development endeavors, except services to older people, promoting and assisting activities designed to meet at the national, state and community levels the problems of those human services development endeavors. The equaeil commission shall serve as an ombudsman on behalf of individual citizens as a class in matters relating to those human services development endeavors under the jurisdiction of State Government. It shall be a spekesman spokesperson on behalf of those human services development endeavors to state agencies, Governor, Legislature, public-at-large and National Government;
- 3. Serve as advisory committee. Serve as the advisory committee on behalf of the State to the state agency relating to or as may be required by state or federal laws and regulations governing administration of programs authorized by this Part and so much of the several Acts, amendments and successors to them enacted by the people of the State and those authorized by the several United States Acts, amendments and successors to them as relate to human services development endeavors, including services to older people funded by Title VI, or their successors or amendments or additions thereto, of the <u>United States</u> Social Security Act, as amended, and excepting all other services to older people:
 - A. The Priority Social Services Act of 1973, except services to older people in accordance with section 6108; and
 - B. Title IV and VI, or their successors or amendments or additions thereto, of the United States Social Security Act, as amended, except those services to older people funded under Title VI, or their successors or amendments or additions thereto, of the United States Social Security Act, as amended.

The eeuneil commission shall advise concerning state and federal plans, policies, programs and other activities relating to human services development endeavors, except services to older people. The eeuneil commission shall submit its recommendations and comments on the state plan, and any revisions thereof, and reports to federal or state agencies. Statements at variance with or in addition to those of a state agency shall be attached to the plan or reports upon submission to agencies of the United States Government or to state agencies;

4. Serve as review committee. Serve, through a subcommittee of the eeuneil commission, eensisting-of-5-persons including-the-chairman-and-4-ether-members-appointed-by-the

- 1 ehairman, as the review committee en-behalf--of--the--State responsible for analysis of proposals and submission of advisory 3 acceptability recommendations concerning the requesting award of state administered grant funds such as, but 5 not limited to, those Acts enumerated in subsection 3. Also, it is intended that the commission is authorized to review proposals 7 received and contracts being developed and administered by the Division of Community Services, Department of Correction, the Department of Educational and Cultural Services, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Mental Health and Mental 11 Retardation and other state agencies affecting human development order endeavors.  - 5. Review and evaluate. Review and evaluate on a continuing basis the purpose, the value and impact on the lives of people, state and federal policies regarding human services pregrams development endeavors and other activities affecting people, except older people, conducted or assisted by any state departments or agencies;

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6. Inform the public. Inform the public to develop a firm public understanding of the current status of the human services development endeavors, except services to older people in Maine the State, including information on effective programs elsewhere in the State or nation, by collecting and disseminating information, conducting or commissioning studies and publishing the results thereof and by issuing publications and reports;

7. Provide public forums. Provide public forums, including the conduct of public hearings, sponsorship of conferences, workshops and other such meetings, to obtain information about, discuss and publicize the needs of and solutions to human service development problems, except problems of older people; and

8. Administer funds. Administer, in accordance with current fiscal and accounting regulations of the State, and in accordance with the philosophy, objectives and authority of this Part and Part 2, any funds appropriated for expenditure by the eouneil commission or any grants or gifts which may become available, accepted and received by the eouneil commission; and make an annual report to the Governor and Legislature not later than September 1st of each year concerning its work, recommendations and interests of the previous fiscal year and future plans; and shall make such interim reports as it deems advisable.
