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27	'Sec. 1. Joint select committee established. The Joint Select Committee on Families and Children is established to evaluate the effectiveness of the state delivery system of child and family
29	services and assistance. The joint select committee shall consist of 13 members of the Legislature, 3 of whom shall be
31	members of the Senate and 10 of whom shall be members of the House of Representatives. The joint select committee shall
33	consist of the following:
35	1. Three members of the joint standing committee of the
37	Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs;
39	2. Three members of the joint standing committee of the
1	Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters;
13	 Three members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resource matters; and
15	4. Four other members of the Legislature.

- Sec. 2. Appointment. The President of the Senate shall appoint 3 members and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 10 members to the joint select committee. No more 3 than 7 members of the joint select committee shall represent the 5 majority party. The presiding officers of the Senate and the House of Representatives shall each appoint a cochair of the joint select committee. 7 Sec. 3. Study and evaluation. The joint select committee shall be responsible for, but not be limited to, the following: 11 1. An evaluation of the effectiveness of the state delivery 13 system of child and family services and assistance; 15 A review of the programs available to families and children and the degree of overlap or duplication, if any, with 17 respect to these programs; 19 An analysis of the problems, if any, with the current delivery system and the courses of these problems; and 21 4. A design for an effective state delivery system of child 23 and family services and assistance which shall include, at a minimum: 25 The structure of the organization or organizations 27 responsible for providing these services and assistance; 29 The programs to be administered and the units in the organization responsible for administering the programs; 31 C. The number of state employees required to implement the proposed delivery system and a breakdown of the number of 33 employees by units within the organization; 35 The number of additional positions required, if any, or 37 the number of existing positions which may be terminated, if any, to implement the proposed delivery system; 39 The cost of administering the new delivery system 41 compared to the administrative costs of the current delivery system; 43 Any other cost savings incurred as a result of the 45 adoption of the joint select committee's proposed delivery system; and
- G. The reasons for the greater effectiveness of the proposed delivery system compared to the current system.

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Sec. 4. Consult with departments. The joint select committee, while conducting the study and evaluation, shall

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9	Sec. 5. Compensation. The joint select committee shall be compensated in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for meetings held when the Legislature is not in
11	session.
13	Sec. 6. Meetings. The joint select committee may be compensated for no more than 12 meetings.
15 17	Sec. 7. Staff. The Legislative Council shall provide for the staffing of the joint select committee.
19	Sec. 8. Report. The joint select committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of
21	the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters of the First Regular Session of the 115th
23	Legislature no later than January 15, 1991.
25	Sec. 9. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

- 4. Recommend, if necessary, a design or master plan for an effective state delivery system of child and family services; and
- Define, in a master plan or design:
 - A. The administrative units of the organization;
- B. The programs to be administered by each unit;
 - C. The number of employees assigned to each unit;
- D. The number of new positions created or the number of existing positions to be terminated; and
- 31 E. The cost of administering the new delivery system and any cost savings.
- The joint select committee will report its findings to the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature.
