3	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

The department shall be administered by a commissioner who shall be appointed by the Governor subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resource matters and subject to confirmation by the Legislature. The commissioner shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.			

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Sec. 2. Application. Notwithstanding the establishment of the Department of Families and Children in this Part, the department shall undertake no administration of programs or services until the plan developed by the Joint Select Committee on Families and Children pursuant to Part B is adopted by the Legislature, except that the department shall carry out the provisions of this chapter.

Sec. 3. Commissioner appointed. The Commissioner of Families and Children shall be nominated by the Governor no later than June 15, 1989, or within 10 days of the effective date of this Act, whichever is later. Upon confirmation by the Senate, the commissioner shall be sworn into office and commence full-time work no later than July 10, 1989. The commissioner shall assist the committee with preparation of a transition plan and implementation of the department pursuant to Part B.

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PART B

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Sec. 1. Transitional process of department. There is established a transitional process beginning June 15, 1989, or within 10 days of the effective date of this Act, whichever is later, and ending June 30, 1991. A plan for implementation of Part A shall be prepared and approved during the period of June 15, 1989 to March 31, 1990.

Sec. 2. Implementation of department. The department shall be implemented and operational on July 1, 1990. During the period of July 1, 1990 to June 30, 1991, the implementation of the department shall be monitored by the committee and the committee shall prepare such further implementation plans or make such

reports as it deems appropriate.

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Sec. 3. Joint select committee established. There is established within the legislative branch a Joint Select Committee on Families and Children. The committee shall consist of 13 members of the Legislature, including 3 members of the Senate and 10 members of the House of Representatives: 3 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs; 3 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Education; 3 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources; and 4 other members of the Legislature. Members of the Senate shall be appointed by the President of the Senate and members of the House of Representatives shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and shall be appointed not later than June 15, 1989, or within 10 days of the effective date of this Act, The following officials of the executive whichever is later. branch shall assist the committee: the Commissioner of Human Commissioner of Mental Health and Services, the Mental of and Retardation, the Commissioner Educational Services and the Commissioner of Corrections or their designees.

Sec. 4. Committee charged. The committee shall develop, in conjunction with the Commissioner of Families and Children and other officials of executive branch agencies, a plan for the establishment of the Department of Families and Children. The plan shall provide for the transfer, to the Department of Families and Children, of the following existing agencies that serve the needs of families and children:

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- 1. The Bureau of Children with Special Needs of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation;
- 2. The Bureau of Social Services of the Department of Human Services;

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- 3. The family and child services functions of the Bureau of Health of the Department of Human Services, including, but not limited to the Handicapped Children's Program, Genetic Disease Program, Public Health Nursing Program, Maternal and Child Health Program, Adolescent Pregnancy and Parenting Program, Family Planning Program, and Women, Infant and Children's Program;
 - 4. Child Development Services, Department of Educational and Cultural Services;

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5. The Headstart Program, Division of Community Services;

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- 6. All juvenile and youth correctional services of the Department of Corrections;
- 7. The Interdepartmental Council; and
- 8. Any other administrative units or functions related to the listed or other activities of State Government serving the family or child.

37 The implementation plan shall provide that the duties of the department shall be to enhance the human development functioning of families and children and to ameliorate family or 39 child disabilities in this State. The plan shall authorize the 41 department to serve by preparing, organizing and offering developmental, educational, health, mental, social The plan shall correctional services to carry out its duties. 43 authorize the department to address family or child disabilities 45 but not limited to: adult abuse and neglect, alcoholism, preschool education, early childhood development, low 47 aspirations, child abuse and neglect, drug abuse, problems, family violence, juvenile delinquency, mental illness, mental retardation, families and children in poverty or with low 49 income, school dropouts, truancy, teen pregnancy and teen suicide.

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The implementation plan shall provide that the method of delivery by the department shall be functionally integrated to offer holistic family focused and child focused services and that families and children shall be served utilizing the principle of one family to one case manager and that all services of the department shall be offered incooperative and coordinated manner consistent with department's functionally integrated pattern of unified and consolidated operations.

The plan shall provide for implementing the policy that families are and should continue to be the preferred environment for raising children and caring for vulnerable family members and shall advance the goals of maintaining family and children as a functioning social unit, providing services to ameliorate dysfunctions or family dissolution, thereby empowering families and children to function independently of the department and protecting each family member from harm or violence.

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The implementation plan shall provide for the transfer and relocation to the department of the agencies, programs and activities listed. The programs shall be analyzed and restructured to attain functional integration of services. Functionally related administrative and service activities shall be consolidated improving geographical accessibility of services.

Sec. 5. Expenses. The members of the committee who are Legislators shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at committee meetings.

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- Sec. 6. Report. The committee shall submit its initial report, together with necessary implementing legislation, by January 1, to amend, repeal and reallocate laws appropriations allocations and reflect the department's to responsibilities and organization. The legislation shall provide for:
- All senior management staff and staff of the commissioner to be appointed by the commissioner with 10 working days notice to the Governor and Legislature;
- All bureau directors or lower midmanagement staff to be appointed pursuant to the personnel law for a term coterminus with the commissioner and removal from office for cause;
- 3. The preparation by the commissioner of a budget for the department; and

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4. Any other recommendations, including legislation, which would properly offer future benefit and service to the general welfare and safety of Maine families and children.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill creates a Department of Families and Children, establishes the Joint Select Committee on Families and Children and authorizes and funds the position of commissioner of the department. Under the bill, the Committee for Families and Children is charged with the development of a plan to unify and consolidate several state agency activities currently serving families and children into a functionally integrated cabinet level department. The plan will define the department's purpose as the enhancement of human development and functioning of families, the amelioration of family or child disabilities and will outline administrative principles to guide the department's operation.
