An Act to Establish a Budget Committee for Kennebec County.

(After Deadline)



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	30-A MRSA c. 3, sub-c. I, art. 8 is enacted to read:
5	ARTICLE 8. KENNEBEC COUNTY BUDGET COMMITTEE
7	§861. Definitions
9	As used in this article, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the following meanings.
13	1. County commissioners. "County commissioners" means the county commissioners of Kennebec County.
15	2. Municipal officers. "Municipal officers" has the same meaning as set forth in Title 1, section 72, subsection 12.
17 19	§862. Kennebec County Budget Committee
21	In Kennebec County there is established the Kennebec County Budget Committee to carry out the purposes of this article.
23	1. Membership. The budget committee shall consist of 9 members, 3 members from each commissioner district selected as
25	provided for in this section. The county commissioners shall serve on the committee in an advisory capacity only and may not
27	vote on any committee matters.
29	In 1990, and thereafter, at least 90 days before the end of every fiscal year, the members shall be elected by the following
31	procedure.
33	A. The county commissioners shall notify all municipal officers in the county to caucus by county commissioner
35 .	districts at a specified date, time and place for the purpose of nominating at least one municipal officer from
37	each district as a candidate for the county budget committee; except that in 1990, at least 3 municipal
39	officers shall be nominated from each district. A county commissioner shall serve as nonvoting moderator for his
41	district's caucus. Nominations shall be received from the floor. The nominee receiving the most votes shall be
43	approved. Any other nominees who receive a majority vote of those present shall also be approved. The names of those
45	duly approved shall be recorded and forwarded to the county commissioners to be placed on a written ballot.
47	B. The county commissioners shall have written ballots
49	printed with the names of those candidates selected in their districts under paragraph A. Each commissioner district
51	shall require a separate ballot and each ballot shall specify each candidate's full name and municipality. The

- 1 county commissioners shall distribute the appropriate ballots to each municipality within a commissioner district. The municipal officers shall vote as a board for 3 one budget committee member from the candidates on the ballot and return the ballot to the county commissioners by 5 a certain date, except that in 1990, the municipal officers 7 shall vote as a board for 3 budget committee members. The ballots shall be counted at a regular meeting of the county commissioners. Each vote shall be weighted according to 9 that municipality's population as a proportion of the district's total population, except that no municipality may 11 have more than one budget committee member. The county 13 commissioners shall notify each municipality, in writing, of the results of the election and shall certify the results to 15 the Secretary of State.
- 2. Duties. The county budget committee shall review the budget estimates prepared by the county commissioners and approve a final county budget.
  - 3. Term of office. The term of office shall be 3 years, provided that a budget committee member remains a municipal officer in the municipal officer's municipality, except that of those elected in 1990, one from each district shall be elected for a term of 3 years; one from each district shall be elected for a term of 2 years; and one from each district shall be elected for a term of one year.
- 4. Vacancies. A vacancy occurring on the budget committee shall be filled by the committee for the balance of the unexpired term. The person appointed to fill the vacant office must be a municipal officer from the same municipality as the person vacating the office.
- 5. Expenses. Members shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed from the county treasury for expenses lawfully incurred by them in the performance of their duties.

The budget committee shall conduct its meetings in public at the county courthouse. The county commissioners shall direct the county clerk to call an organizational meeting of the budget committee no later than 60 days before the end of the county's fiscal year. The county commissioners shall provide the committee with necessary clerical assistance, office expenses and suitable meeting space, as well as access to county files and information. The budget committee shall adopt its own rules or procedures and bylaws.

## §864. Budget procedures

- 1. Proposed budget. The county commissioners shall submit an itemized budget estimate, as described in sections 701, 702 and 7503, to the budget committee in a timely fashion, no later than 60 days before the end of the county's fiscal year.
- 2. Budget review process. The budget committee shall review the proposed itemized budget prepared by the county commissioners, together with any supplementary material prepared by the head of each county department or provided by any independent board or institution or another governmental agency.

  The budget committee may increase, decrease, alter or revise the proposed budget, provided that:
- A. The budget committee shall enter into its minutes an explanation for any change in the estimated expenditures and revenues as initially presented by the county commissioners; and
- 21 B. The total estimated revenues, together with the amount of county tax to be levied, must equal the total estimated expenditures.
- 25 3. Public hearing. The budget committee shall hold a public hearing in the county on the proposed budget before the end of the county's fiscal year and before the final adoption of 27 the budget. Notice of the hearing shall be given at least 10 29 days before the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation within the county. Written notice and a copy of the proposed budget shall be sent by registered or certified mail with return 31 receipt requested, or delivered in person, with proof received of 33 the delivery, to the clerk of each municipality in the county. The municipal clerk shall notify the municipal officers of the 35 proposed budget.
- 37 4. Adoption of budget. After the public hearing is completed, the budget committee may further increase, decrease, alter and revise the proposed itemized budget, subject to the 39 conditions and restrictions imposed in subsection 2. The proposed 41 itemized budget must be finally adopted by a majority vote of the budget committee at a duly called meeting not later than the end of the county's fiscal year. The approved budget is the final 43 authorization for the assessment of county taxes. The budget 45 shall be sent to the county commissioners and the county tax authorized shall be apportioned and collected in accordance with 47 section 706.
- 5. Interim budget. If the budget is not approved before the start of a fiscal year, until a budget is finally adopted, the county shall operate on an interim budget which may not exceed the previous year's budget.

	6. Transfer of funds. The county commissioners may
3	transfer funds as provided in section 922.
5	§865. Budget amendments
7	The approved budget shall govern the expenditures of the county during the fiscal year. No expenses may be incurred in
9	excess of those shown in the approved budget, but the budget may
11	be revised from time to time by the preparation and submission of a proposed amended budget by the county commissioners to the budget committee. The budget committee shall render, not less
13	than 15 calendar days, except in emergencies, nor more than 30 days after the submission to it, a decision on any such revised
15	budget. An approved revised budget shall be transmitted to the State Auditor within 15 days of the budget committee's action.

	§866. Filing of county budget

	A copy of the final budget and subsequent amendments shall
21	be filed, on forms approved by the Department of Audit, with the State Auditor, who shall retain them for 3 years.
