13	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1202, L.D. 1672, Bill, "An Act Concerning Public Water Supplies in the Mid-coast Area"
15	Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the
17	enacting clause the following:
19	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
21	as emergencies; and
23	Whereas, it is of interest to the Camden and Rockland Water Company to start planning for the future water needs of the
25	region as soon as possible; and
27 29	Whereas, the present moratorium on the water company's use of Hobbs' and Fish's Ponds would run out before the end of the 90-day period after adjournment of the Legislature; and
31	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
33	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
35	safety; now, therefore,'
37	Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "Sec. 1." by inserting after the last sentence (page 1, line 32 in
39	L.D.) the following: 'Any authority granted in this Act shall be exercised in accordance with all applicable state and local
41	regulatory requirements.'
43	Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 3 (page 2, lines 1 to 27 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the
45	following:
47	'Sec. 3. Moratorium established. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 302, no water may be taken or
49	withdrawn by the Camden and Rockland Water Company from Hobbs'

Pond, Fish's Pond or Quiggle Brook in Hope, Maine, until the company has complied with all applicable state and federal laws
 and until the following have occurred.

5 1. A ground water extraction and treatment system, approved by the Department of Environmental Protection, has been installed 7 and is fully operational at the Union Chemical hazardous substance site and is sufficient for the Board of Environmental 9 Protection to determine its effectiveness in remediating the contaminated ground water and retarding the movement of the plume, and to determine that the drawdown of Fish's Pond or 11 Hobbs' Pond will not have an effect on the ground water so that contaminated ground water associated with the Union Chemical site 13 is drawn to Fish's Pond or Hobbs' Pond or to private wells in the 15 These determinations shall be made after a public hearing area. which shall be held on the board's own motion or on the request 17 of either the Town of Hope, Hobbs' - Fish's Pond Association or the Camden and Rockland Water Company.

 The Department of Environmental Protection shall hold a
 public hearing prior to action on any application by the Camden and Rockland Water Company to install a permanent water intake
 pipe in Hobbs' Pond or Fish's Pond under the Natural Resources Protection Act, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section
 480-A et seq.

Sec. 4. Exemption. Notwithstanding section 1 of this Act, the Town of Hope Fire Department may take or withdraw water from
 Hobbs' Pond, Fish's Pond or Quiggle Brook for the purpose of fighting fires.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 33 preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

39 The amendment adds an emergency preamble and an emergency clause. It clarifies the extension of water rights to
41 Megunticook Lake provided in the original bill. It establishes a moratorium on the Camden and Rockland Water Company's withdrawal
43 of water from Hobbs' and Fish's Ponds until the hazardous waste site around Union Chemical in Hope is corrected.
