IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Amend the Lobster and Crab Fishing License Law.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6406, as amended by PL 1979, c. 283, \S 2, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
5	<u>§6406. Engaging in activities while under suspension</u>
7	
9	1. Prohibited acts. It shall be unlawful for any person whose license is under suspension to:
11	A. Engage in any licensed activity;
13	<u>B. Give another person permission to raise, lift, transfer</u> or possess lobster traps or cars marked with the suspended
15	<u>person's lobster and crab fishing license number or lobster</u> traps with buoys that carry the color design on file with
17	the suspended license; or
19	<u>C. Assist a holder of a Class II or Class III lobster and crab fishing license as a crew member.</u>
21	2. Penalty. Violation of this section shall be a Class D
23	crime, except that the court shall impose a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$1,000.

7 This bill establishes a Class II and Class III lobster and crab fishing license. A holder of a Class II and Class III
9 license will be authorized to hire 1 or 2 unlicensed crew members to assist the license holder under the supervision of that
11 license holder.
