COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B " to S.P. 607, L.D. 1701, "Resolve, to Create the Commission to Study the Establishment of a State and Tribal Partnership to Encourage Economic Development"

Amend the resolve in section 2 in subsection 3 in the first line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Five" and inserting in its place the following: 'Four'

Further amend the resolve in section 2 in subsection 4 in paragraph B in the first line (page 1, line 24 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and"

Further amend the resolve in section 2 in subsection 4 in paragraph C in the first line (page 1, line 26 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "be it further"

Further amend the resolve in section 2 in subsection 4 by adding at the end the following:

'D. The Presque Isle Band of Micmac Indians; and be it further'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of sections 5 to 7 and inserting in their place the following:

Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission may submit any report or implementing legislation it prepares pursuant to this Act to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council and to the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature by January 31, 1991; and be it further

Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That all members of the commission serve without compensation.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This amendment adds the Micmac Indians to the membership of
6 the Commission to Study the Establishment of a State and Tribal
8 Partnership to Encourage Economic Development and requires that
10 all members of the commission serve without compensation. The
12 commission has the option to submit any report or legislation it
prepares to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council and
to the Legislature by January 31, 1991. This amendment also
removes the need for the appropriation contained in the original
bill.
