COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1227, L.D. 1706, Bill, "An Act to Create the Quantabacook Water District"

Amend the bill in the 2nd paragraph after the title in the 2nd line (page 1, line 6 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and to" and inserting in its place the following: 'so the district may'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in the 3rd paragraph in the first line (page 1, line 48 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "The" and inserting in its place the following: 'Other than the water sources purchased from the Quantabacook Water Company, the'

Further amend the bill in section 13 in the first paragraph in the 2nd sentence in the first line (page 7, line 22 in L.D.) by striking out the word "without" and inserting in its place the word 'with' and in the 5th. line (page 7, line 26 in L.D.) by inserting after the word "district" the following: ',not to exceed \$1,500,000,'

Further amend the bill in section 17 in the 13th line (page 8, line 50 in L.D.) by striking out the word "question:" and inserting in its place the following: 'questions:'

Further amend the bill in section 17 after the first referendum question by adding the following:

'"Shall the Quantabacook Water District establish a bonded indebtedness limit of \$1,500,000?"'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment corrects the grammar in a whereas clause of the emergency preamble. It makes it clear that the water district does not need to go through the Public Utilities Commission's approval process to develop the water sources already used by the Quantabacook Water Company. Further it establishes a bonded indebtedness limit of \$1,500,000 and requires voter approval of bond issues.
