An Act to Amend the Law Concerning the Reimbursement Rates for General Adult Courses Offered by Adult and Community Education Programs.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	20-A MRSA §8607-A, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 496, §4, is amended to read:

7	6. General adult courses. Courses provided for the general public in vecational,leisureand life skill programs shall be
9	reimbursed at the rate of 50% of the cost of instructional salaries and fringe benefits required for salaried costs.

29	This bill provides an educational subsidy only for life skill programs in adult educational general courses which develop
31	an individual's personal or professional life skills to enhance their capacity, both as a citizen and worker.
33	The Department Education and Cultural Services has proposed this change to require that leisure programs offered through
35	adult and community education programs be self-sustaining.
37	The deletion of the word "vocational" is based on the fact that adult vocational education courses are specifically eligible
