28	education requirements set forth in that paragraph and has achieved a passing grade, as determined by the board, on the
30	journeyman's examination. A licensed journeyman-in-training may assist in making plumbing installations under the direct
32	supervision of a journeyman plumber or a master plumber, but may not act <u>as</u> , or represent-himself-as profess to be, a journeyman
34	plumber, as defined in subsection 3. A journeyman-in-training license shall-be is issued for a single nonrenewable period of 4
36	years, and such a license may be issued only once to any individual. The-fee-for-a-journeyman in training-license-shall

 apprentice program. That person will be paid from funds generated from an increase in licensing fees; and
