An Act Amending the Licensure Requirements for Plumbers.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §3301, sub-§1-C is enacted to read:
5	1-C. Apprentice. "Apprentice" means any person who is
7	engaged in learning and assisting in the installation of plumbing and drainage under an apprenticeship program acceptable to the
9	board.
11	Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §3501, sub-§2, ¶A, as amended by PL 1987, c. 597, §10, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
13	A. A minimum of 3 years with 6,000 hours of work in the
15	field of plumbing installations as a trainee plumber under the employment and direct supervision of a master plumber, completion of a 45-hour board approved code course in the
17	current code and obtaining a passing grade as determined by the board on the journeyman's examination;
19	Sec. 3. 32 MRSA §3501, sub-§2, ¶B, as repealed and replaced by
21	PL 1983, c. 468, §17, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
23	B. A minimum of 4,000 hours of work in the field of
25	plumbing installations as a journeyman-in-training under the employment and direct supervision of a master plumber,
27	provided that the work experience is obtained within 4 years of the date upon which the applicant was issued a
29	journeyman-in-training license. A journeyman-in-training license shall be issued upon sworn application for that
31	license to any person who has satisfactorily completed one academic year of instruction and who has obtained a passing
33	grade, determined by the board on the journeyman's examination; or

37	C. A minimum of 8,000 hours in an approved program
39	registered with the State Apprenticeship and Training Council and completion of 576 hours of related instruction.
41	Persons qualifying under this paragraph may take the journeyman's examination after completion of the 576 hours

45	Sec. 5. 32 MRSA $\S3501$, sub- $\S2$ -A, \PA , as amended by PL 1987, c. 597, $\S11$, is further amended to read:
47	A. A minimum of at least one year with 2,000 hours of work
49	in the field of plumbing installations as a journeyman plumber er-a-minimum-of-at-least-4-years-with-8,000-hours-of
51	werk-in-the-field-of-plumbing-installations -as-a-trainee plumber under the employment and direct supervision of a
53	master plumber, -er-the-equivalent; and

	Sections 2, 3 and 4 will increase by one year the experience
