rmation centers in Kittery, Yarmouth, Calais and Houlton. The staffing of these centers is currently provided by a private contractor through the State's contract-bidding process, renegotiated on an annual basis. In fiscal year 1988-89, \$575,000 was appropriated, the majority to pay for information center personnel and the rest mailroom services and postage to send out literature. For a contract extension in Part I of the proposed fiscal year 1989-90 budget, \$632,500 is budgeted and \$695,750 is proposed for fiscal year 1990-91.

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To ensure the long-term permanent staffing of the 4 Department of Transportation tourism information centers, and to ensure that the State has the long-term capability to respond through the mail to tourism inquiries, this bill creates 16 full-time and 44 seasonal and part-time state employee positions under the Department of Economic and Community Development, Division of Tourism, beginning July 1, 1990. The 16 full-time positions include: one information manager, 9 full-time tourism information specialists at the State's 4 tourism information centers, 5 data entry, telephone and postal clerks and one full-time stockroom clerk and driver.

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Total appropriations for this bill for fiscal year 1990-91 is \$788,612, with \$105,000 being returned to the General Fund through the sale of maps, literature, mailing labels and nominal

- 1 brochure transportation charges. The net expenditure of \$683,612
- represents a reduction in funds needed, and a significant increase in services provided, and will be a major step toward 3 fulfilling the State's long-term responsibilities to Maine's
- 5 largest industry.
