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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1238, L.D. 1729

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

Nonprofit and for profit organizations are providing widespread health screening tests that may violate current law.
This amendment clarifies that this testing is legal and allows health screening services to provide testing without the direct
involvement of a physician. The amendment does not change the legal or licensing requirements for directors of medical laboratories or laboratory technicians.
