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### STATEMENT OF FACT

Nonprofit and for profit organizations are providing widespread health screening tests that may violate current law.

This bill clarifies that this testing is legal and allows freestanding health screening facilities to provide testing without the direct involvement of a physician. This bill does not change the legal or licensing requirements for directors of medical laboratories or laboratory technicians.
