STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Concerning the Workers' Compensation Laws.

(After Deadline)

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

39 MRSA §4, first ¶, as amended by PL 1985, c. 737, Pt. A, §117, is further amended to read:

An employer who has secured the payment of compensation in conformity with sections 21-A to 27 is exempt from civil actions, either at common law or under sections 141 to 148, Title 14, sections 8101 to 8118, and Title 18-A, section 2-804, involving personal injuries sustained by an employee arising out of and in the course of his employment, or for death resulting from those injuries. This—exemption—from—liability—applies—to—all employees,—supervisors,—efficers—and—directors—of—the—employer for—any—personal—injuries—arising—out—of—and—in—the—course—of employment,—or—for—death—resulting—from—those—injuries. These exemptions The exemption also apply applies to occupational diseases sustained by an employee or for death resulting from those diseases.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill removes the immunity from liability which is presently extended to employees and management for any personal injuries or occupational disease sustained by an employee in the course of employment.

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
