An Act to Change the Status of a Newly Established Position.



1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

3 **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §933, sub-§1, ¶A,** as enacted by PL 1983, c. 729,  
5 §4, is amended to read:

7 A. ~~Deputy Commissioner~~ Commissioners;

9 **Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §933, sub-§1, ¶B,** as enacted by PL 1983, c. 729,  
11 §4, is repealed.

13 **Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §933, sub-§1, ¶G,** as amended by PL 1983, c.  
15 862, §11, is further amended to read:

17 G. Assistant to the Commissioner for Public Information; and

19 **Sec. 4. 5 MRSA §933, sub-§1, ¶H,** as enacted by PL 1983, c.  
21 862, §11, is amended to read:

23 H. Assistant to the Commissioner for Potato Marketing; and

25 **Sec. 5. 5 MRSA §933, sub-§1, ¶I** is enacted to read:

27 I. Director of Planning and Information.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

29 This bill converts a position, Director of Planning and  
31 Information, in the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural  
33 Resources, from the classified service to an unclassified major  
policy-influencing position serving at the pleasure of the  
appointing authority.

35 The bill also corrects references to major  
policy-influencing positions to be consistent with existing laws.
