COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 645, L.D. 1738, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Maine Coastal and Inland Surface Oil Clean-up Fund to Provide for Adequate Resources to Respond to a Major Coastal Oil Spill"

Amend the bill in section 2 in paragraph A in the 3rd line (page 1, line 27 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "3¢ per barrel of" and inserting in its place the following: '~~per-barrel~~ of'

Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 4. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

4 of 3¢ per barrel for crude oil, gasoline and all other refined
5 products; and
