Resolve, Concerning the Dam on Mattawamkeag Lake.

(AFTER DEADLINE)



Director of Bureau of Public Lands authorized to repair and manage dam. Resolved: That the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands is authorized to repair, maintain and operate the Mattawamkeag Lake Dam to ensure that sufficient water levels exist in the Mattawamkeag Lake to allow for the free movement of fish in and out of the lake, to support wildlife, to provide protection for shore property, and to ensure sufficient water levels for safe boating; and be it further

Bureau of Public Lands authorized to acquire land. Resolved: That, in order to accomplish these purposes, the Bureau of Public Lands is authorized to acquire by eminent domain, purchase or gift the following described land, together with all right, title and interest in and to the Mattawamkeag Lake Dam.

The land in Township 4, Range 3, County of Aroostook, and State of Maine, to wit:

Beginning at an iron rod situated at the intersection of the Bible Point Road and the Silver Ridge Road near so-called Bible Point boat landing on the westerly shore of the outlet of Mattawamkeag Lake in said Township 4, Range 3; thence South 74 degrees, 3 minutes, 50 seconds West, 558.7 feet along the centerline of said Bible Point Road to an iron rod; thence South 55 degrees, 2 minutes, 55 seconds East, 728.0 feet to an iron rod located on the centerline of a road located on the easterly side of said Mattawamkeag River and Lake; thence North 33 degrees, 8 minutes, 55 seconds East, 329.8 feet along the centerline of said road to an iron rod situated on the southerly boundary of land, now or formerly, leased by the Maine Forest Service; thence North 38 degrees, 44 minutes, 20 seconds West, 122 feet to an iron rod situated on the east shore of said Mattawamkeag Lake; thence North 39 degrees, 21 minutes, 25 seconds West, 257.6 feet to the point of beginning.

Also conveying all right, title, and interest of the Grantor in and to the bed of Mattawamkeag Lake and the West Branch of the Mattawamkeag River as lies between the lines of the above described lot extending to the center of the bed of said lake and river.

Also conveying all right, title, and interest of the Grantor in and to the Mattawamkeag Lake Dam.

And, together with and appurtenant to the above described parcel of real estate, a right of way now established 33 feet in width, and known as the Silver Ridge Road and extending from the Bible Point Road to United States Route

1	II in Sherman, Maine. Said right of way to be used in

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve authorizes the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands to repair, maintain and operate the Mattawamkeag Lake Dam to ensure sufficient water levels in the lake to support wildlife, and to protect the interests of shoreline property owners. To accomplish these purposes, this resolve authorizes the Bureau of Public Lands to acquire by eminent domain, purchase or gift, land together with all right, title and interest in and to the Mattawamkeag Lake Dam.
