15	Amend the bill by inserting after section 9 the following:
17	'Sec. 10. 1 MRSA §1025 is enacted to read:
19	§1025. Prohibition against acceptance of honoraria
21	1. Legislator. For purposes of this section, "Legislator"
23	means a Senator or a member of the House of Representatives.
25	2. Honorarium. For purposes of this section, "honorarium means a payment of money or anything of value to a Legislator for
27	an appearance or speech by the Legislator. Honorarium does not include:
29	A. Reimbursement for any actual and necessary trave
31	expenses incurred by the Legislator or an aide in connection with the appearance or speech; and

35	B. A payment for an appearance or speech if the appearance or speech is unrelated to the Legislator's official capacity or duties.

39	3. Prohibition. It is unlawful for a Legislator to accept an honorarium.
41	4. Penalty. Any Legislator who violates this section shall
43	be subject to a civil penalty, payable to the State, not to exceed twice the value of the honorarium.

	Honorarium does not include:
13	A. Reimbursement for any actual and necessary travel

	B. A payment for an appearance or speech if the appearance
19	or speech is unrelated to the person's official capacity or

35	Legislators and executive branch officials. Acceptance of an honorarium would be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed
37	twice the value of the honorarium.
