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23	<ol> <li>Legislator. For purposes of this section, "Legislator" means a Senator or a member of the House of Representatives.</li> </ol>
25	2. Honorarium. For purposes of this section, "honorarium" means a payment of money or anything of value to a Legislator for
27	an appearance or speech by the Legislator. Honorarium does not include:
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31	A. Reimbursement for any actual and necessary travel expenses incurred by the Legislator or an aide in connection with the appearance or speech; and
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35	B. A payment for an appearance or speech if the appearance or speech is unrelated to the Legislator's official capacity or duties.
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39	3. Prohibition. It is unlawful for a Legislator to accept an honorarium.
41	<b>4. Penalty.</b> Any Legislator who violates this section shall be subject to a civil penalty, payable to the State, not to
