25	8. Lobbying restricted. No former executive employee may represent or personally appear before a joint standing committee
27	of the Legislature to which legislation has been referred that involves matters that were within the responsibilities of that
29	former executive employee until 12 months following the departure of the former executive employee from the executive branch
31	position.'
33	Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 14 and inserting in its place the following:
35	'Sec. 14. 5 MRSA §19-A is enacted to read:
37	<u>\$19-A. Prohibition against acceptance of honoraria</u>
39	1. Executive employee. For purposes of this section,
41	"executive employee" has the same meaning as in section 19.
43	2. Honorarium. For purposes of this section, "honorarium"

It is unlawful for an executive employee to accept an honorarium. 11 13 4. Penalty. Any executive employee who violates this section shall be subject to a civil penalty, payable to the State, not to exceed twice the value of the honorarium.' 15 Further amend the bill to renumber the sections to read 17 consecutively. 19 STATEMENT OF FACT 21 23 This amendment replaces the honorarium section of the original bill with the honorarium provisions from the minority report.
