#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 6 MRSA §19 is enacted to read:

#### §19. Small community air service program

- 1. Findings and purpose. It is intent of the Legislature to establish a small community air service program in order to promote intrastate service to underserved communities within the State. It is further the intent of the Legislature to subsidize this service as necessary to provide an adequate level of air transportation to small communities within the State.
- 2. Small community air service. In order to promote essential air service, the Department of Transportation shall administer a program, patterned after the federal essential air service program, to ensure that small communities have adequate levels of service. This program shall take into consideration a minimum round trip and minimum seating criteria for each eligible point to destinations within the State which provide access into the national air transportation system.
- 3. Eligibility requirements. To be eligible for subsidy, an air carrier must be certified by the Federal Aviation Administration to provide scheduled air service to the eligible point and must demonstrate a need for subsidy. The eligible point must be currently served by no more than one air carrier providing scheduled service.
- 4. Expanded service. Communities desiring to receive new service must demonstrate a capability to support that service through passenger enplanements.
  - 5. Adoption of rules. The Department of Transportation shall promulgate rules necessary to administer this section. The rules shall establish the formula for reimbursement and application requirements.
- Sec. 2. Evaluation of service needs and program. The Department 39 of Transportation shall undertake a study to evaluate minimum air 41 carrier service needs to communities within the State including air service frequency, aircraft utilization, seating capacity and 43 trip destinations. The study shall also evaluate and recommend adjustments to the reimbursement formula developed pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 6, section 19, subsection 5. 45 recommendations, including any necessary implementing legislation, shall be submitted to the First Regular Session of 47 the 115th Legislature.
- Sec. 3. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
