### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Establishing the Higher Education Students Financial Assistance Board.

(EMERGENCY)

**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Legislature recently enacted Public Law 1989, "An Act to Provide Comprehensive, Consolidated б chapter 559, Student Financial Assistance Services," which established a program within the Finance Authority of Maine to administer a 8, comprehensive, consolidated system of student financial 10 assistance programs and created the Student Financial Aid Transition Advisory Committee to provide the Legislature with 12 advice on implementation of the program; and

14 Whereas, this legislation will establish the Higher Education Students Financial Assistance Board within the Finance
 16 Authority of Maine, facilitating the nomination of members to the board and permitting the commencement of a nationwide search for
 18 a director of the newly created Division of Higher Education Students Financial Assistance; and

Whereas, the transition committee has recommended this legislation as necessary to ensure the smooth transition described in Public Law 1989, chapter 559 and provide the necessary leadership at an early date, prior to the development and implementation of all the legislation necessary to accomplish the transition; and

28 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 30 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 32 safety; now, therefore,

2. Conflict of interest. No member may be deemed to have a 2 conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest pursuant to Title 5, section 18, solely because of that member's use of the programs of or association with a post-secondary 4 educational institution, high school or financial institution, provided that no member participates in an official capacity with 6 respect to any matter which has an effect, on that member or on the institution with which that member is associated, that is 8 unique and distinct from the effect on the general public or 10 persons engaged in similar professions, trades, businesses or employment or associated with similar institutions.

3. Term of office. Except for the initially appointed members, members shall serve 4-year staggered terms and shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified.

A. Of the 6 members of the board first appointed, 2 shall serve for terms expiring June 30, 1991, 2 shall serve for terms expiring June 30, 1992, and 2 shall serve for terms expiring June 30, 1993. All the initial appointments shall be effective no later than January 15, 1990.

B. A member of the board shall be eligible to serve not more than 2 full consecutive terms, provided that terms expiring on or before June 30, 1993, are not considered full terms. All full terms shall expire on June 30th of the 4th year of the term.

<u>C. Any member of the board may be removed by the Governor</u> for cause.

32 <u>4. Organization.</u> Each year the board shall elect from among its members a chair, vice-chair and any other officers it 34 requires. The board shall meet at the call of the chair or at the request of 3 of its members. Five members shall constitute a 36 <u>quorum and no official action of the board may be taken unless supported by at least 4 members of the board.</u>

5. Compensation. Each member of the board shall be compensated by the authority in accordance with Title 5, chapter <u>379, following approval of expenses by the chief executive</u> officer.

 6. Policies. The Higher Education Students Financial Assistance Board shall, from time to time, recommend to the members of the authority the adoption, amendment or repeal of rules, policies or administrative procedures for carrying out this subchapter.

50 Sec. 9. Transition provision. Prior to the appointment and qualification of a least 5 members of the Higher Education 52 Students Financial Assistance Board, hiring of a director of the

Division of Higher Education Students Financial Assistance of the 2 Finance Authority of Maine may be done by the chief executive officer of the Finance Authority of Maine in consultation with 4 the Student Financial Aid Transition Advisory Committee established by Public Law 1989, chapter 559. Subsequent legislation pursuant to Public Law 1989, chapter 559 will further 6 provide protection for the jobs and benefits of current employees of the Department of Educational and Cultural Services, Bureau of 8 School Management, Division of Higher Education Services, who are 10 transferred to the Finance Authority of Maine.

# **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

#### FISCAL NOTE

18 The Finance Authority of Maine will be able to absorb the additional costs of this legislation within the funds 20 appropriated for this purpose during the First Regular Session of the 114th Legislature.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

26 This bill establishes the Division of Higher Education Students Financial Assistance within the Finance Authority of 28 Maine, creates the Higher Education Students Financial Assistance Board to advise the Finance Authority of Maine with respect to administration of programs affecting financial assistance for 30 students in post-secondary educational institutions and enables the hiring of a director of the division. 32 As stated in the emergency preamble, this bill is designed to ensure that the 34 necessary administrative structure is in place to permit a smooth transition of student loan programs to the Finance Authority of 36 Maine in January 1990, as described in Public Law 1989, chapter 559.

Section 1 of the bill creates the board and provides for 40 compensation at the rate of the legislative per diem.

42 Section 3 creates the Division of Higher Education Students Financial Assistance within the Finance Authority of Maine.

44
Section 4 of the bill pertains to the 2 members of the
46 Higher Education Students Financial Assistance Board who will serve on the Finance Authority of Maine or FAME board.

48 Section 5 provides that the chief executive officer shall 50 consult with the Higher Education Students Financial Assistance Board in the hiring of the Director of the Division of Higher

Education Students Financial Assistance.

Section 7 makes the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 18, pertaining to conflicts of interest, apply to the new board and staff and clarifies that the chief executive officer must file the personal financial statement required of executive employees under Title 5, section 19.

Section 8 details the membership of the new Higher Education Students Financial Assistance Board, the terms of office and organizational matters and provides for policy recommendations to the FAME board. Further substantive provisions regarding the new board's duties and responsibilities are left for future legislation pursuant to Public Law 1989, chapter 559.

16 On an interim basis, section 9 provides that the director may be hired in consultation with the Student Financial Aid 18 Transition Advisory Committee. Section 9 also indicates legislative intent that current employees of the Department of 20 Educational and Cultural Services who are transferred to the Finance Authority of Maine will retain current rights and 22 benefits to be provided for in future legislation.
