SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 687,
L.D. 1808, Bill, "An Act Concerning Errors and Inconsistencies in
the Laws of Maine"

Amend the amendment in Part B by inserting after section 7
(page 4, line 20 in amendment) the following:


Sec. 8. P&SL 1989, c. 75. §5 is amended to read:

Sec. 5. Disbursement of bond proceeds. The proceeds of the
bonds set out in section 6 shall be expended under the direction
and supervision of the ~~Commissioner of Environmental Protection~~
Executive Director of the Maine Waste Management Agency.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment amends the General Fund bond issue for
recycling equipment and facilities by transferring the authority
to direct and supervise the disbursement of bond proceeds from
the Commissioner of Environmental Protection to the Executive
Director of the Maine Waste Management Agency. The Maine Waste
Management Agency was established by the First Regular Session of
the 114th Legislature to provide, among other types of solid
waste management assistance, financial and technical assistance
to solid waste regional associations and municipalities for
recycling initiatives. The disbursement of recycling bond
proceeds is appropriately within the Maine Waste Management
Agency's assigned statutory responsibilities.
