STATE OF MAINE SENATE 114TH LEGISLATURE SECOND REGULAR SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "^A " to S.P. 700, L.D. 1838, "Resolve, 14 to Study the Use of Herbicides"

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16 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the emergency preamble and before the emergency clause and inserting 18 in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Use of Herbicides is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission shall be comprised of the following 13 members: two Senators appointed by 24 the President of the Senate; 3 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House 26 of Representatives; 2 members representing the forest products industry, one appointed by the President of the Senate and one by 28 the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 2 members representing the general public, one appointed by the President 30 of the Senate and one appointed by the Speaker of the House of 2 members representing environmental 32 Representatives; and interests, one appointed by the President of the Senate and one 34 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; the Commissioner of Transportation or the commissioner's designee; and a representative of an electric utility jointly appointed by 36 the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and be it further 38

Sec. 3. Appointments: meetings. **Resolved:** 40 That all appointments be made no later than 30 days following the 42 effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall be notified by all appointing 44 authorities when the selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of the 46 commission by July 1, 1990. The commission shall select a Legislator from its membership as chair; and be it further

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2 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall meet 5 times to study the current use of herbicides in Maine and the 90 policy implications of that use. The commission shall review the information on the effects of herbicide use on forests, natural 6 habitats, water quality and other environmental impacts and the implications of the methods of applying those herbicides. In 8 addition, the commission shall hold 2 public hearings throughout the State to hear public comments on the use of herbicides in 10 Maine's forests; and be it further

12 Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any recommended legislation, to the 14 First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature by December 1, 1990; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall request from the Legislative Council sufficient staff assistance to carry out these duties. The commission may also call upon the assistance of the Department of Conservation and the Pesticides Control Board; and be it further

Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the
commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the
legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes,
Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission
meetings. All members of the commission who are not state
employees are entitled to receive expenses, as defined in Title
5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of
the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further

32 Sec. 8. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of 34 this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer the fund.

STATEMENT OF FACT

12 This amendment changes the original bill to add 2 additional members to the commission, specify that 2 public hearings will be 14 held, allow the commission to draw on the staff of the Department of Conservation and the Pesticides Control Board, amend the 16 appropriation to reflect the expanded membership and, to more clearly define the role of the commission.
