#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

Resolve, Authorizing Robert Pineo of Old Orchard Beach to Bring a Civil Action against the State and the Department of Corrections.



Action against the State and the Department of Corrections authorized. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the Maine Tort Claims Act, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14, chapter 741, Robert Pineo, of Old Orchard Beach, be authorized to bring suit against the State and the Department of Corrections for damages caused by the alleged negligence of the State and the Department of Corrections. Robert Pineo was sentenced to the Maine Correctional Center at Windham and began his sentence on or about February 5, 1988. He had Crohn's disease when he was admitted to the Maine Correctional Center about which the Maine Correctional. Center was advised. It is alleged that during his incarceration and due to the negligence of the Maine Correctional Center and the State, Robert Pineo was denied necessary medications and treatment, necessary sanitary facilities, hot and cold running water, prompt and proper medical care and diet and was subjected to cruel and unusual punishment. All of the foregoing treatment facilities were necessary to maintain his health and well-being. As a result of the negligence of the State, Robert underwent multiple surgical procedures including permanent removal of his large intestines, the total removal of a permanent ileostomy, treatment οf rectum, numerous complications infections and other postoperative requiring hospitalization and revision of the ileostomy. These surgical procedures occurred in 1988 and 1989.

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Action is to be brought within one year of the passage of this resolve in the Superior Court of Cumberland County. Liability and damages shall be determined according to state law as in any action between individuals. The complaint issuing out of the Superior Court under the authority of this resolve shall be served on the Secretary of State by attested copy by the sheriff or the sheriff's deputies in any county in the State. The Attorney General is authorized and designated to appear, answer and defend this action.

Any judgment that may be awarded in this civil action against the State or the Department of Corrections shall be payable from the Treasurer of State on final process issued by the Superior Court or, if applicable, the Supreme Judicial Court. Total recovery by Robert Pineo in this action from all sources shall not exceed an aggregate of \$500,000 plus hospital and medical expenses. Hearing shall be before a Justice of the Superior Court with or without a jury.

Nothing in this resolve may be construed to increase the limitations on liability of, or to diminish the defenses of, any employee of the State or any employee of the Department of Corrections under the Maine Tort Claims Act.
