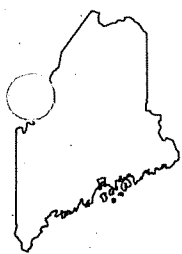

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**An Act to Increase Funding for the Displaced Homemakers Program to Continue Rural Outreach, Employment and Training and Support Services for Maine Displaced Homemakers.**

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2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from  
the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

14 expenses for 3 Rural Resource Coordinator

22 development activities; 2 clerical staff  
positions to provide critical program

30 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

32 This bill provides funds to the Displaced Homemakers Program  
34 for 7 permanent staff positions and operating expenses to ensure  
the continuation and expansion of outreach, employment and  
36 training, support services and coordination of resources to  
displaced homemakers living in rural areas of the State.
