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> IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

An Act to Increase Funding for the Displaced Homemakers Program to Continue Rural Outreach, Employment and Training and Support Services for Maine Displaced Homemakers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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Provides funds for staffing and operating expenses for 3 Rural Resource Coordinator positions to maintain and expand outreach, direct services and coordination of resources in rural areas of the State; 2 employment and training positions to focus on linkages with and placement in education, training, employment and economic development activities; 2 clerical staff positions to provide critical program management support; resources to reimburse travel expenses of statewide Displaced Homemakers Advisory Council members; and additional support services for displaced homemakers.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides funds to the Displaced Homemakers Program for 7 permanent staff positions and operating expenses to ensure the continuation and expansion of outreach, employment and training, support services and coordination of resources to displaced homemakers living in rural areas of the State.
